REPUBLIC ACT 8976 AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE PHILIPPINE FOOD FORTIFICATION PROGRAM FOR  
OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, as mandated by Republic Act No. 8976, fortified food products used by every citizen in all food outlets, restaurants, calenderers, food handlers and food processing in daily diet to counter the serious malnutrition problem now affecting the population particularly to pregnant and or lactating mothers;

WHEREAS, using fortified product for human consumption will improve the health of the constituents specially those in the remote areas to solve malnutrition problem;

WHEREAS, to ensure the wider coverage of its implementation, this august body adopt said measures to be disseminated throughout the municipal jurisdiction involving all barangay officials as the front liners of the enforcement of the law;

NOW THEREFORE, after due deliberation and on motion of Hon. Estrella S. Zapatos, duly seconded by Hon. Samuel G. Baculpo Sr., Hon. Inocencio A. Limbang and Hon. Felizardo I. Gayapa Sr., it was

RESOLVED, as this body hereby resolved to adopt and strongly support the dissemination and enforcement of Republic Act 8976 otherwise known as the "Philippine Food Fortification Act" to ensure the implementation of said law within the jurisdiction of Siayan as a solution of a serious malnutrition problem in the area.

RESOLVED FINALLY, the copies of this resolution be furnished to all residents, food outlets, calenderers, and all concern, for their information and appropriate action.

PREFATORY STATEMENT

Rice straws/hulls, corn stalks/husks, weeds, grasses and other farm waste makes fine compost, crop residues and mulches which are important ingredients in the production of biological or organic or natural fertilizers;

Organic matter act as a store for nutrients, increases action exchange capacity of the soil, build up humus that makes soil dynamic, good conditioner, and holds more nutrients which are much needed by the plants;

Nowadays, many of our farmlands are unproductive, highly weathered and impoverished in plant nutrients, organic matter and water retentive capacity; bereft in fertilizer and product.

It is too basic and fundamental principle in agriculture that soil is the foundation of quality food production, hence, if we feed the soil with organic matter which are food of the microbes or beneficial microorganism, then symbiotically they also feed the plant. Microbes make natural fertilizer although they are not the fertilizer. Microbes also stabilize and fix nutrients in the clay, and and loam environment naturally enriching them with macro and trace elements. Moreover, through the biological action of other living organism, air, water and sunshine, the



unproductive land will be enriched with growth stimulating nitrogen, phosphate and potash. Then too, humic acids, root dividing hormones and antioxidant are created along with many other compounds and successfully feed the plants being grown naturally.

The burning of rice straws/hulls, corn stalks/husks, weeds, grasses and other biodegradable farm waste in the usual and common practice in most farms in our locality which is environmentally destructive as it destroys most of the nitrogen, sulfur, magnesium and some potassium and makes silicon and other micro-nutrients or trace elements less available to plants. With the rising cost of chemical fertilizers, it pays to convert the plant residue into compost to reduce the cost producing rice and corn while protecting our environment.

The burning of crop residues in other way increases carbon dioxide emission into the atmosphere and contributes to global warming hence should be stopped if not minimized hence this ordinance

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan in session assembled.

SECTION I. This shall be known as "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE BURNING OF RICE STRAWS/HULLS, CORN STALKS/HUSKS, GRASSES, WEEDS AND OTHER FARM WASTE AND PENALIZING ANY VIOLATORS THEREFORE"

SECTION II. ORDAINING CLAUSE. Burning of rice straws/hulls, corn stalks/husks, grasses, weeds and other farm waste within the vicinity of the farmland hereby prohibited

SECTION III. PENALTY CLAUSE. Any violation of this ordinances shall be penalized in the following offense

First Offense .....	Php 200.00
Second Offense .....	500.00
Third Offense .....	1,000.00

SECTION IV. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason any section or provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, other sections of provisions which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION V. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect 60 days after approval of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, posting of copies at conspicuous places and publication in official gazette

The Annual Budget for the year is only 42,478,250.00 therefore there is a difference of php3,457,289.00 which is subject to budgeting

BE IT ORDIANED by the Sangguniang Bayan in session assembled

SECTION I. TITLE. This shall be known as "AN ORDINANCE MAKING AVAILABLE THE AMOUNT OF Php 3,457,289.00 REPRESENTING INTERNAL REVENUE ALLOTMENT DIFFERENCE FOR VARIOUS EXPENDITURES EMBODIED IN SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET NO. 2, CY 2005"


SECTION II. ORDAINING CLAUSE. That the amount of THREE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY SEVEN THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED EIGHTY NINE PESOS (Php 3,457,289.00) is hereby made available for expenditures embodied in Supplemental Budget No. 2, CY 2005 which is form part of this Ordinance

SECTION III. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect upon approval by the Hon. Sangguniang Panlalawigan in the Province of Zamboanga del Norte



Since there being no further business before the Honorable Sangguniang Bayan in session assembled thus the Chair declared session adjourned at 5:00 O'clock in the afternoon.


