

Series of 2022**

"A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE DEVOLUTION TRANSITION PLAN OF BARANGAY DENUYAN, SIAYAN, ZAMBOANGA DEL NORTE PROVIDING THE BARANGAY GOVERNMENT WITH A ROADMAP TO ENSURE STRATEGIC, SYSTEMATIC AND COHERENT ACTIONS TOWARDS THE FULL IMPLEMENTATION OF FUNCTIONS, SERVICES, AND FACILITIES TO BE FULLY DEVOLVED BY NATIONAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES (NGAs) CONCERNED, STARTING FY 2022."

WHEREAS, Section 25, Article II of the Constitution provides that the State shall ensure the autonomy of local governments;

WHEREAS, Section 6, Article X of the Constitution provides that local government units (LGUs) shall have a just share, as determined by law, in the national taxes which shall be automatically released to them;

WHEREAS, Section 2 (a) of the Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991 (Republic Act No. 7160) provides that the State shall provide for a more responsive and accountable local government structure instituted through a system of decentralization whereby local government units (LGUs) shall be given more powers, authority, responsibilities, and resources. The process of decentralization shall proceed from the national government (NG) to the local government units LGUs;

WHEREAS, Section 3 (d) of the LGC further provides that "the vesting of duty, responsibility, and accountability in local government units shall be accompanied with provision for reasonably adequate resources to discharge their powers and effectively carry out their functions; hence, they shall have the power to create and broaden their own sources of revenue and the right to a just share in national taxes and an equitable share in the proceeds of the utilization and development of the national wealth within their respective areas";

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court (SC) decision in the consolidated cases of Congressman Hermilando I. Mandanas, et al. vs. Executive Secretary Paquito N. Ochoa, Jr. et al. and Honorable Enrique T. Garcia, Jr. vs. Executive Secretary Paquito Ochoa, et al. clarifies the basis for the computation of local government shares and ordered the national government to include all collections of national taxes in the computation of the base amount for the just share of LGUs;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 138, s. 2021 orders the full devolution of functions, services, and facilities by the national government (NG) to local governments (LGUs) no later than the end of FY 2024. These shall include those devolved responsibilities indicated in Section 17 of RA 7160 and in other existing laws which subsequently devolved functions of the NG to LGUs. These fully devolved responsibilities shall be funded from the share of the LGUs in the proceeds of the national taxes and other local revenues;

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Executive Order No. 138, s. 2021 orders all local governments to prepare their Devolution Transition Plans (DTPs) in close coordination with the NGAs concerned especially with regard to devolved functions and services that are critical to them;


WHEREAS, the DBM-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) No. 2021-1 requires all LGUs to prepare their DTPs to ensure a dated strategic perspective and systematic and coherent actions towards their full assumption of devolved functions and services starting in FY 2022;

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Vergel A. Insag duly seconded by majority of the members present, it was:



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 03 S. 2021

ORGANIZATION OF BARANGAY DEVOLUTION TRANSITION COMMITTEE (DTC)

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 2 (a) of Republic Act (RA) No. 7160 or the Local Government Code of 1991 (LGC), the State shall provide for a more responsive and accountable local government structure instituted through a system of decentralization whereby local government units (LGUs) shall be given more powers, authority, responsibilities, and resources. The process of decentralization shall proceed from the National Government (NG) to the LGUs;

WHEREAS, Section 3 (d) of RA No. 7160 further provides that the vesting of duty, responsibility, and accountability in LGUs shall be accompanied with provision for reasonably adequate resources to discharge their powers and effectively carry out their functions; hence, they shall have the power to create and broaden their own sources of revenue and the right to a just share in national taxes and an equitable share in the proceeds of the utilization and development of the national wealth within their respective areas;

WHEREAS, The Supreme Court (SC) decision in the consolidated cases of Congressman Hermilando I. Mandanas, et al. vs. Executive Secretary Paquito N. Ochoa, Jr. et al. and Honorable Enrique T. Garcia, Jr. vs. Executive Secretary Paquito Ochoa, et al.² clarifies the basis for the computation of local government shares and ordered the NG to include all collections of national taxes in the computation of the base amount for the just share of the LGUs. This is pursuant to Section 6, Article X of the 1987 Philippine Constitution which provides that the LGUs shall have a just share in the national taxes which shall be automatically released to them;

WHEREAS, In line with the implementation of the SC Ruling, Executive Order (EO) No. 138, s. 2021 orders the full devolution of functions, services, and facilities by the NG to the LGUs not later than the end of FY 2024. Except for those functions that shall continue to be shared with the NG pursuant to the guiding principles enumerated under EO No. 138, s. 2021 and its IRR, starting FY 2022, the LGUs shall be primarily and ultimately responsible and accountable for the provision of all basic services and facilities fully devolved to them, in accordance with the minimum standards for service delivery to be prescribed by the NG.

WHEREAS, to support transition to full devolution, Section 10 of EO No. 138, s. 2021 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations instructs all LGUs to formulate and prepare their Devolution Transition Plans (DTPs) to guide the transition in their full assumption of the devolved roles and responsibilities;

WHEREAS, The LGU LIP preparation shall be undertaken in close coordination with the NGAs concerned, especially with regard to devolved functions and services critical to them. The provinces, cities, municipalities, barangays TO organize the LGU Devolution Transition Committee (LGU DTC) which shall be responsible for the preparation of the LGU DTP and in monitoring the implementation thereof;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Hon. Enerson G. Ansacon, by the powers vested in me by law as the Punong Barangay of Denuyan, Municipality of Siayan, Zamboanga del Norte, do hereby organize the Devolution Transition Committee to compose of the following:

Section 1. COMPOSITION - The composition of the Barangay Devolution Transition Committee shall be the following:


Section 2. FUNCTIONS – the Barangay Devolution Transition Committee (DTC) shall be responsible for the preparation of the LGU DTP and in monitoring the implementation thereof.

Section 3. CONTENTS OF THE LGU DEVOLUTION TRANSITION PLAN – the Barangay Devolution Transition Plan shall be comprised of the following attachments:

- State of Devolved Functions, Services, and Facilities – *Attachment 1-B: Inventory of LGU Functions, Services, and Facilities for Barangays (Annex E-2);*
- Phasing of Full Assumption of Devolved Functions, Services, and Facilities –*Attachment 2-B: Phasing of Full Assumption of Devolved Functions, Services, and Facilities for Barangays (Annex F-2);* and
- Capacity Development Requirements – *Attachment 3-B: Capacity Development Requirements for Barangays (Annex G-2).*

Section 4. EFFECTIVITY. This order shall take effect immediately.

It is important because it communicates to the barangay stakeholders and the public the intention of the barangay to implement the transition to full devolution. The message shall be able to convey also to the public the purpose and the use of the DTP, which are as follows:

- This serves as the roadmap for the BLGU to ensure a strategic, systematic, and coherent actions toward its full assumption of devolved functions and services in FY 2022;
- As benchmark in monitoring the progress of the BLGUs full assumption of devolved functions and services;
- As a primary consideration in the formulation of future local development plans and investment programs, and in the implementation of priority PPAs relative to the devolved functions and services;
- As basis for establishing partnerships and cooperative undertakings with national government agencies, and other governance stakeholders such as the NGOs, CSOs, POs, business sector, and academic institutions.

D. Quick Facts About the Barangay

It is a one- or two-page barangay profile that provides snapshot of the barangay in terms of the following:

- Geographic profile (e.g., land area, political boundaries/subdivisions, etc.)
- Demographic (e.g., population, population annual growth rate, household population, number of households, population density, etc.)
- Social profile (e.g., educational, health and security facilities, etc.)
- Economic profile (e.g., no. of business establishments, BLGU income, BLGU National Tax Allotment (NTA), employment, etc.)

Presenting the above information thru maps and other form of visuals makes the DTP more interesting to the readers.

E. Section 1: State of Devolved Functions, Services, and Facilities

This section describes the state of devolved responsibilities in the barangay and how the increase in the just share of barangays and the full devolution of functions, services, and facilities by the NGAs concerned will affect the operations and service modalities of the LGUs. Below are some focus questions to help the barangay describe this section:

- What devolved functions, services, and facilities are already implemented or performed by the barangay?
- Which of these devolved responsibilities are considered to be the priority/ies of the barangay, and why?
- Which of the programs/projects/activities along devolve responsibilities implemented by the barangay are already making headways in terms of delivering results?
- Are there devolved responsibilities that have yet to be fully assumed by the barangay? If there are, what are these responsibilities?
- What are some of the reasons why the barangay was not able to assume these responsibilities or implement the PPAs along these devolved responsibilities?
- Are there emerging good/unique practices that the barangay is happy to include in their DTP?

F. Section 2: Phasing of Full Assumption of the Devolved Functions, Services, and Facilities

This section presents the functions, services, and facilities to be fully devolved by the NGAs concerned to the barangays, the phasing and full assumptions by the barangay of the devolved responsibilities.

In determining the fully devolved responsibilities critical to the barangay, and in phasing of their full assumption of these devolved responsibilities, the barangay may consider the following factors in their decision-making:

- Development issues arising in the locality or priority needs of barangay constituents;
- Human resource capacity of the barangay to implement the responsibilities to be fully devolved;
- Barangay fiscal resources to fund the responsibilities to be fully devolved; and
- Availability of external technical support (e.g., NGAs, NGO, academe).

G. Section 3. Capacity Development (CapDev) Requirement

This section shall describe the capacity development requirements of the barangay to absorb, manage, and sustain the responsibilities under a fully devolved set-up.

In consultation with the barangay stakeholders, the Barangay Development Transition Committee (DTC) revisits the functions, services, and facilities to be fully devolved by the NGAs concerned and then identify the capacity development requirements (e.g., trainings, seminars, etc.) covering FY 2022-2024 needed by the barangay to fully assume these devolved responsibilities by 2024.

The Barangay DTC ensures that their prioritized capacity development requirements are included in their AIP FY 2022 or LDIP FY 2022-2024.

- The Barangay DTC assesses the annual capacity building requirements of the barangay covering FY 2022-2024 with reference to the responsibilities it will fully assume and in consideration of their phasing strategy. The Barangay Secretary consolidates the assessment results and prepares **Attachment 3-B: Capacity Development Requirements for Barangays (Annex G-2)** and submit it to Barangay Treasurer for review of the financial requirements of the proposed capacity development interventions;
- The Barangay Treasurer reviews **Attachment 3-B (Annex G-2)** and endorses it for approval of the Punong Barangay;
- The Punong Barangay approves **Attachment 3-B (Annex G-2)** and submits it to the Sangguniang Barangay for approval together with the two (2) other forms **Attachment 2-B (Annex F-2)** and **Attachment 1-B (Annex E-2)**, when approved. **The three (3) attachments, taken together, constitutes the Barangay DTP.**

SECTION 1. STATE OF DEVOLVED FUNCTIONS, SERVICES AND FACILITIES FOR BARANGAYS

Section 17 of Republic Act No. 7160 or the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that local government units shall endeavor to be self-reliant and shall continue exercising the powers and discharging the duties and functions currently vested upon them. They shall also discharge the functions and responsibilities of national agencies and offices devolved to them pursuant to this Code. Local government units shall likewise exercise such other powers and discharge such other functions and responsibilities as are necessary, appropriate, or incidental to efficient and effective provision of the basic services and facilities.

Such basic services and facilities for Barangays include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Agricultural support services which include planting materials distribution system and operation of farm produce collection and buying stations;
- Health and social welfare services which include maintenance of Barangay health center and day-care center;
- Services and facilities related to general hygiene and sanitation, beautification, and solid waste collection;
- Maintenance of Katarungang Pambarangay;
- Maintenance of Barangay roads and bridges and water supply systems
- Infrastructure facilities such as multi- purpose hall, multipurpose pavement, plaza, sports center, and other similar facilities;
- Information and reading center; and
- Satellite or public market, where viable.

After the enactment of the Local Government Code of 1991, barangays were also given additional functions and responsibilities through the passage of the following laws, to wit:

- Republic Act No. 9003 or the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2003;
- Republic Act No. 10742 or the Sangguniang Kabataan Reform Act of 2015;
- Republic Act No. 10121 Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010;
- Executive Order No. 56 s. 2018 or the Effective Implementation of Emergency 911;
- Executive Order No. 12 S. 2017 or the Implementation of Responsible Parenthood and Reproductive Health at the LGUs;
- Republic Act No. 1344 or the Juvenile Justice and Welfare Act of 2006; and
- Republic Act No. 9275 or the Philippine Clean Water Act of 2004.

In line with the implementation of the Supreme Court Ruling on Mandanas and Garcia Petitions, President Rodrigo R. Duterte issued Executive Order No. 138 s. 2021 ordering full devolution of certain functions of the executive branch to local government units. In response, National Government Agencies (NGAs) formulated their respective Devolution Transition Plans to guide LGUs including barangays on what functions, services and facilities as well as specific programs, projects and activities to be devolved to them.

Based on our assessment, the following are the devolved functions, services and the facilities currently implemented or existing in our barangay, to wit:

1. agricultural Support services which including planting materials distribution system
2. Sports and facilities/covered court
3. Maintenance to Farm and Market Road (FMR)
4. Maintenance of Hanging footbridge
5. Maintenance of Water System Supply
6. Infrastructure Facilities such as Multi- purpose Hall, Multi-purpose pavement and other similar Facilities
7. Establishment of Material Recovery Facility in a Barangay –owned or leased land
8. Allocation of Barangay Funds for solid waste Management Program activities
9. Maintenance of Barangay Health Station and provision of Health Services and Facilities related to general hygiene and sanitation and mobilizing volunteers.
10. Maintenance of EARLY Child Care Development Center.
11. Strengthening of gender and Development Focal point and allocation 5% of the regular fund of GFAD
12. Establishment and strengthening of Local Council : allocation of 1% of the NTA of Barangay for the programs of LCPC
13. Establishment and Maintenance of a functional Violence Against Women (VAWC) Desk
14. Maintenance of Katarungang Pambarangay
15. Organization of 18 Tanods
16. Allocation of Barangay Budget Funds
17. Appropriation of 5% to the NTA for Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction Management
18. Compliance with Barangay Full Disclosure Board Policy
19. Levy and Collection of taxes , service fees or charges that shall accrue exclusively to the Barangay
20. Conduct of Barangay Assemblies each semester

Also, the following are the devolved functions, services and facilities not yet implemented or not existing in our Barangay, to wit:

1. Operation farm produced collections and buying station
2. Information and reading center
3. Maintenance OF Local Risk Map, establishment of Early Warning System link page with the City's EWS;
4. Establishment and maintenance of Kasambahay Desk.

Which of the FSFs THAT ARE ALREADY EXISTING ARE PRODUCING RESULT/OUTCOME IN THRE COMMUNITY?

The Barangay Denuyan has existing projects such as Farm to Market Road, Hanging footbridge, Covered court, Barangay Multi-purpose Hall, Streetlights, Potable Water system level II, Day Care Center can served for everybody in this Barangay.

Construction of Open Canal in Purok Lower, upper, centro

The LGU considers the community in purok lower, upper and centro as the beneficiary for this significant project because the area is frequently flooded every time there is heavy downpour , and there is difficulty of passage for residents during rainy season. The construction of the open canal allows rainwater gateway to freely flow to a water gateway preventing possible flooding in the community and ensuring the safety of residents in the purok.

Of these devolved responsibilities , Barangay Denuyan considers the establishments of the Barangay Nursery as the priority program because the barangay recognizes the fact that the financial support from the national government is not always available to all, and in order for the Barangay to become self-sufficient especially under the covid-19 pandemic ,food security is very important . With the establishment of a nursery, the germination percentage (thee likelihood for the new seedlings to propagate is high) and as a result , the Barangay would be self-sufficient when it comes to food production. With the establishment of the nursery, the farmers will have a regular source of seedlings to ensure greater yield.

The devolved responsibilities implemented by the Barangay are already making headways in terms of delivering results in food production under the current pandemic.

1. Establishment of materials recovery facility
2. Enactment of policies pertaining to solid waste management from segregation of waste from source to actual disposal
3. issuance of resolution adopting solid waste management related policies by the sangguniang Bayan such as Zero Policy , among others.

Under RA 9003, the barangays are primarily responsible for the effective solid waste management, particularly, garbage segregation and disposal. To comply with this mandate, Barangay Denuyan endeavors to establish materials recovery facility, in act policies pertaining to solid waste management related policies enacted by the Sangguniang Bayan such as Zero Plastic Policy, among others.

The Barangay has already implemented the establishment of a Materials recovery facility; however, the facility was damaged due to the recent typhoons. This Barangay commits rehabilitate the same and make it functional or operational starting this year onwards. As regards enactment of policies pertaining to solid waste management, this barangay had already issued the same in the past however, the lack of enforcement of these pieces of legislation was fatal.

SECTION 2. PHASING OF ASSUMPTION OF FUNCTIONS, SERVICES, AND FACILITIES FOR BARANGAYS.

Section 4 of Executive No. 138 s. 2021 states that the devolved functions, services and facilities from the National Government should be fully assumed by the Local Government Units not later than the end of FY 2024 which include those indicated under Section 17 of RA 7160 and other existing laws. Local Governments shall primarily and ultimately accountable for the provision of all devolved basic services and facilities in accordance with the standards for service delivery to be prescribe by the NG. the basic services and facilities fully devolved shall be funded from the share of the LGUs in the proceeds of national taxes and other local revenues.

For the next three (3) years, the following functions, services, and facilities will be fully assumed by the Barangays, to wit:

📅 2022

1. Construction of 1 Unit Health Center

📅 2023

1. Information and Reading Center

📅 2024

1. Agricultural support services which include planting materials distribution system
2. Operation farm produce collection and buying station

SECTION 3. CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT (CapDev) REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BARANGAYS

In view of the full devolution of certain functions from the NGAs, the Provinces, Cities, and Municipalities are directed to formulate their respective capacity development agenda based on the assessment framework and guidelines to be issued by the DILG-LGA. The capacity development agenda shall be guided by, among others, the strategy to enable the LGUs to absorb, manage, and sustain the responsibilities under a fully devolved set-up. For Barangays, they shall determine their capacity development requirements based on the functions and services they will fully assume, guided by the NGA DTPs, if available, local development thrusts, and performance goals and objectives.

Capacity is the ability of the LGUs to perform functions to fulfill their accountabilities and produce desired results. The capacity development requirements for the Barangays will be our guide in implementing capacity development initiatives. It is roadmap of appropriate individual and organizational enhancement interventions corresponding to an identified LGU deliverable within specific timeframes and available resources.

The following are the capacity development interventions we have identified to be implemented from 2022-2024. (*Arrange by year*)

1. Construction of Health Center – 2022
2. Information and Reading Center -2023
3. Operation Farm Produce Collection and Buying station- 2024
4. Agricultural support services which include planting materials distribution system.
